This year's General Fund budget

When we think about our giving to God through his church it is helpful to understand that every church has to fund itself, and to know how much we have, and what we spend it on.

What about the money we pay to the Diocese?

The Common Fund is a pot of money paid into by congregations across the Diocese (Diocese Offer). It is used to provide and support ministers, and to further the work of the Church in every parish across the Diocese of Rochester.

The Diocese is a wonderfully diverse and vibrant community of faith, with each parish facing different challenges and needs. Our Diocesan vision expresses our ambition to meet these challenges as a family of faith, supporting each other as we seek to grow disciples, enrich communities and resource our mission and ministry.

The Common Fund helps us realise this ambition. It means every contribution matters.

How much money should we give?

The New Testament teaches us to be generous in giving to God. Many Christians follow the Old Testament norm of 10% when considering their giving across the spectrum of their local church and other Christian causes. Not everyone, of course, can manage that amount. So we simply ask you please to consider prayerfully how much you are able to give to St Mark's.

We may have different amounts of money and have different abilities and talents. These talents and gifts, like our possessions and wealth, are generous gifts from a generous God, and we offer them back to God to use within St Mark's and our wider community.

Think about planned giving

Many of our church family give a set amount to the church each week, month or year, usually by standing order.

As a parish we have joined the Parish Giving Scheme, which enables us to give by Direct Debit. If you sign up to this you will make a big difference to St Mark's finances. Your gift will benefit your church even when you are away. It will also help our treasurer, who will have a little less admin and a much better idea of how much the church will have and how we can support our vision and plans for the future.



What we give

Our gift to God is something between ourselves and God. We are not here to tell anyone what they should be giving.

What we ask you to do is pray, think, and decide what is the right level for you.
